## STUDENTS AT RISK

Students at risk of not achieving English entry level to TAFE programs,

- MUST enrol in Winter and/or Summer school. Additional costs apply. Colleges will advise students of this requirement.
- Students still not meeting the standards required for TAFE entry may be required to enrol in further ELICOS courses. Additional costs apply.

## RESOURCE FEES

Central TAFE English Language Centre: ELICOS students must purchase or rent their text book. Rental charges are \$75 for the time of study and are non-refundable.

Swan TAFE English Language Centre: There are no extra material costs. Students are given a Swan TAFE file in which to keep their worksheets.

## SWAN TAFE – ENGLISH LANGUAGE CENTRE (BENTLEY CAMPUS)

Swan TAFE's Bentley campus is located in a landscaped garden setting, ideal for study. The campus is 7 km, a 15 minute drive, south of the Perth city centre, directly opposite Curtin University and adjoining Perth's premier technology park. Buses are frequent and provide easy access to and from the city. Shopping centres in Bentley, South Perth and Victoria Park are close by. If students plan to continue their studies at Swan TAFE or Curtin University, studying English here is the perfect choice.

### Facilities

- Computer assisted language laboratory that ensure fast, effective learning.
- Fax and email facilities so students can stay in contact with friends and family back home.
- Free internet use and several translation packages are offered to students.
- Learning resource centre located on campus which gives students access to reference books, international newspapers, computers, language videos and cassettes.
- A café-restaurant which offers a wide range of Asian and Western food.
- A bakery, butcher, bistro and restaurant selling delicious products created by hospitality students.
- Reliable public transport servicing Swan TAFE and Curtin University.

### Services

Swan TAFE's Bentley campus offers complete support to international students. It is known for its excellent pastoral care and study programs.

### Services include:

- Visa information, assistance with rental agreements and information about further career options either at TAFE or University.
- Assistance with study requirements and extra tutoring.
- Opportunities for students to experience TAFE award classes and attend a variety of lectures while studying English.

### Orientation

Students are:

- Assessed to place them into an appropriate level.
- Introduced to the International Centre and teaching staff.
- Given a full tour of the college (class rooms, cafeteria, library, restaurant, language laboratory and staff rooms).
- Provided with an orientation booklet which explains all the requirements of the College.

- Provided with a study file.

All courses, class levels and timetables are explained in detail.

### English Language Courses – NEAS accredited

General and Academic English (5-40 weeks) – Beginner to Advanced.

Courses are designed to take students to their desired English level – whether it is to improve their English skills for general communication and lifestyle purposes, or to gain entry into mainstream TAFE or tertiary courses.

IELTS Ready Preparation (upper intermediate).

Both the general and academic streams are targeted to give students practice sitting IELTS tests in an IELTS simulated environment. Feedback is provided.

### Cambridge Courses:

- Preparation for Cambridge Preliminary English Test (PET) 12 weeks – Pre-Intermediate.
- First Certificate in English (FCE) – Intermediate.
- Cambridge Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) – Upper Intermediate.

Students are prepared for the popular Cambridge examinations with Cambridge initiated and approved course material culminating in mock exams and feedback.

### English Language Courses – TAFE accredited

Certificate IV English for Academic Purposes (18 weeks) Intermediate to Advanced.

This course is especially designed for students wishing to enter University. After the 18 week course, successful students will be able to apply their reading, writing, listening, speaking and study skills to complete tertiary (TAFE and university) assignments and communicate confidently in academic situations.

Certificates I to IV in Spoken and Written English (20 week courses). Please note it may be possible to complete these certificates in a shorter period according to student's progress.

The Certificate I Course is especially for students just starting to learn English.



### Teaching Methodology and Materials

Increasing the skills of our students to communicate in English in reading, writing, listening and speaking, is the main emphasis of our English courses.

An awareness of Australian culture, current affairs, skills for living in Australia or other English speaking countries, and study skills for further education are important parts of our English program. All the teachers are highly qualified and educated and must meet teaching standards which include a recognised pre-service teaching qualification, plus or including an appropriate TESOL qualification, or a recognised degree or diploma.

Teaching material is selected from reputable English language teaching publications to target each student's particular needs and requirements. Students are given a Swan TAFE file to manage their English resources and to facilitate study.

### Assessment

Students are assessed using the International Second Language Proficiency Rating (ISLPR) and need to achieve a 2.5 in speaking, listening, reading and writing in order to commence a TAFE mainstream course.

Every task submitted during the term is marked and recorded on a Student Progress Record so that students and their families can see each student's English language progression. Mid and end term tests provide a further check on progress.

### Qualifications, Awards or Accreditations

- A Certificate on completion of all courses.
- Student Reports indicating English levels (ISLPR levels), progress, participation and punctuality.
- IELTS Ready Preparation Course.
- Cambridge UCLES Certificate in PET, FCE and CAE.

### Social & Recreational Program

Students are taken on an excursion toward the end of each term. Destinations are chosen to help students with their language skills and show them Australia and may include Harmony Day celebrations; the Perth Mint; Swan River cruise; Kings Park; Aboriginal performances, and many others. Swan TAFE students are encouraged to join the gymnasium at Curtin University and any of the sporting opportunities available at the nearby Victoria Park Recreational and Leisure Centre. Basketball, badminton, and other sporting/fitness activities are available.

## CENTRAL TAFE – ENGLISH LANGUAGE CENTRE (PERTH CAMPUS)

Perth Campus is located in the heart of Northbridge, Perth’s cultural, restaurant and entertainment district, in a seven-storey building with views of the campus and city surroundings. If students like the inner city life, they will enjoy studying at Perth Campus.

### Facilities

- Fully-equipped computer labs with internet access.
- Well-equipped Library and Independent Learning Centre (ILC) with computers, international newspapers and over 2000 books, videos and CD’s specifically designed for English language learners.
- Bookshop, gymnasium, banking facilities, prayer room, international student kitchen, café-restaurant, outdoor alfresco areas and garden courtyard.

### Services

The International Centre provides four full-time student advisors, a counsellor, and a homestay coordinator to assist students. The staff can help with course information, career advice, personal issues, visa enquiries, accommodation advice, information on social and recreational activities and how to settle in a new country.

### English Language Courses – NEAS Accredited

General English (Elementary to Upper Intermediate) aims to give students the language skills and cultural knowledge needed to make the most of their time in Australia. Classes focus on language used in everyday life and provide opportunities to visit various cultural sites around Perth.

### English for Academic Purposes (Intermediate to Advanced)

Aims to prepare student for study in Certificate and Diploma courses at TAFE. It emphasises language use in an academic context. Students learn the speaking, listening, reading and writing skills needed to interact with their classmates and cope with assignments and prepares students for TAFE courses in areas such as travel, business and hospitality.

### IELTS Plus – Preparation for IELTS & Further Study (Upper-intermediate)

This course is for students preparing to enter tertiary courses at University or TAFE in Australia. The course focuses on two areas: one, developing skills and knowledge needed to take an IELTS examination; two, improving the academic language and study skills in an Australian context. Speaking, listening, reading and writing are developed using a range of materials and topics common in IELTS exams.

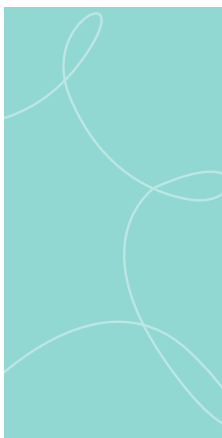
### International Business English

International Business English (Upper Intermediate to Advanced) aims to improve students’ English language ability by practising speaking, listening, reading and writing in a range of business contexts. Topics covered include banking & finance, employment, industrial relations, management, marketing and advertising. Class activities are designed to improve the students’ practical business and academic skills using a range of real business materials and working through authentic business tasks.

### Timetables

- All classes meet Monday through Friday.
- There are 2 shifts Monday through to Thursday—an early shift and the late shift.
- All Friday classes run 8:30 – 4:00.

### Teaching Methodology and Materials

Central TAFE uses practical teaching methods and learner-centred approaches to deliver their English courses. Programs are designed and customised for students' needs. Teachers are friendly, professional and highly qualified in English Language teaching.

### The program also includes:

- Monitoring of student satisfaction.
- A variety of teacher-created, published, authentic and up to date teaching materials, media and activities.
- Web based materials and appropriate text books. The teaching team has been nominated for TAFE awards for commitment to customer service.

### Assessment

- Students' writing, reading and listening skills are assessed upon arrival and students are placed into the correct class for their level.
- Continuous assessment takes place throughout the term.
- Formal assessment takes place at the end of each term.
- Assessments that take place in Term 2 and Term 4 are used to ascertain whether students are eligible to enter an award course at TAFE.
- The assessment scale used is the International Second Language Proficiency Rating Scale (ISLPR).

### Orientation

Students will be greeted by International Centre staff who will:

- Provide information on living and studying in Perth.
- Assist with matters such as accommodation and opening bank accounts.
- Arrange library access and an international student card with transport concession.

Students will also be given a tour of the college and an English placement test.

### Qualifications, Awards or Accreditations gained

- Certificate on completion of all courses.
- Student reports indicating English levels, ISLPR levels, progress, participation and punctuality.
- Certificates are recognised by TAFE WA and NEAS Australia.

### Social & Recreational Program

Students can:

- Join special sightseeing activities around Perth and Western Australia (professional tour companies will organise these especially for international students during school holidays).
- Join social programs organised by the Council for International Students WA (CISWA) at a minimal cost.
- Join class excursions and a graduation party at the end of each semester.

At the end of term there is a party for all students. This could be a beach party, scenic cruise on the Swan River, tennis party or barbeque.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY TO TAFE PROGRAMS

Students who want to study courses at TAFE have their English levels assessed on

- the student's most recent school records, or
- an IELTS (International English Language Testing System) 5.5 Academic test, or
- a TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) 530 print based test, or
- a TOEFL 197 Computer based test, or
- a TOEFL 71 Internet based test, or
- a TAFE WA Test (results will determine required standard to enter a TAFE course).

Please note ETI reserves the right to require any students, whose actual English performance is found not to be consistent with the IELTS scores they presented to ETI with their Application form, to sit an independent English performance test.

The student will be required to meet all the cost of undertaking this independent test should the score not be consistent with that provided to ETI on application.

If the student has not met the necessary IELTS standard they will be required to undertake an ELICOS course of study. All costs involved: course fees, visa extension if required etc are to be met by the student.

## HOW TO APPLY

### Step 1:

Complete the Application Form and indicate how many weeks you want to study. Send the papers to ETI or to the ETI education agent in your country ([www.eti.wa.edu.au](http://www.eti.wa.edu.au)).

### Step 2:

You will receive a letter of offer from ETI.

### Step 3:

Once all the conditions of your offer have been met, you can pay the tuition fees. Fees can be paid directly to ETI's bank account or online by visiting our website at [www.eti.wa.edu.au](http://www.eti.wa.edu.au). Credit Card payments are also accepted by Education & Training International.

### Step 4:

ETI will send a Confirmation of Enrolment form which you will need in order to apply for a Student Visa at the Australian High Commission or Embassy in your country.

### Step 5:

Please ensure that you arrive in Perth in time for your Orientation Program.

### Step 6:

Your level of English will be assessed when you arrive at the College. You will be placed in the class most suitable to your level.

Please Note:

- The course fees do not include living costs, textbooks, stationery, accommodation or other student requirements.
- The course fees paid at enrolment will apply for the length of the ELICOS course.

### The student\* must:

1. Meet TAFE course requirements and meet the requirements of DEEWR-DIAC Course Progress policy – refer to website [www.eti.wa.edu.au](http://www.eti.wa.edu.au) for policy and procedure.
2. Ensure requirements are met and maintained for accommodation and welfare arrangements for students under 18.
3. Notify the International Student Coordinator at their TAFE College of their residential address within seven days of arrival and of any change to their residential address within seven days of any change.
4. Notify the International Students Coordinator at their TAFE College immediately if they terminate their studies, withdraw from their course, or there are any changes to their visa status.
5. Not engage in activities that contravene Australian law, students who do so will be automatically dismissed and reported to DIAC.
6. Not cheat, all cheating (including plagiarism) is forbidden and will result in course failure.
7. Allow other students to learn in a safe and suitable environment.

\*In the case of students under 18 years of age, the parent or guardian must ensure compliance with all of the above.

### ETI/TAFE will:

- Provide the student with the same level of instruction and educational services as normally provided to other students enrolled at TAFE.
- Provide an orientation program for the student.
- Monitor the welfare of the student and provide counselling and ongoing support while the student is enrolled at TAFE.
- Appoint one or more staff members, to act as the point of contact for students, who have access to up-to-date detail of TAFE's support services for students.

### OVERSEAS STUDENTS HEALTH COVER (OSHC)

All international students must pay the OSHC for themselves and all dependent members of their family staying with them in Australia. Students currently studying in Australia must provide ETI with a copy of their health fund membership records showing name, membership number and date of expiry. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that their OSHC is up to date.

### FEE PAYMENT POLICY

- ELICOS programs are payable entirely in advance.
- Payment options and methods are detailed on the statement of account issued with an offer letter.
- ETI does not accept in person cash payments.
- Unpaid fees will result in the automatic cancellation of a student's enrolment at the end of any appeals process. International students are required to demonstrate to DIAC sufficient funds to cover their studies in Australia. As such, financial hardship is not considered grounds for appeal.
- ETI does not accept liability for any fees paid to an agent or third party in relation to an application for enrolment.

### REFUND POLICY

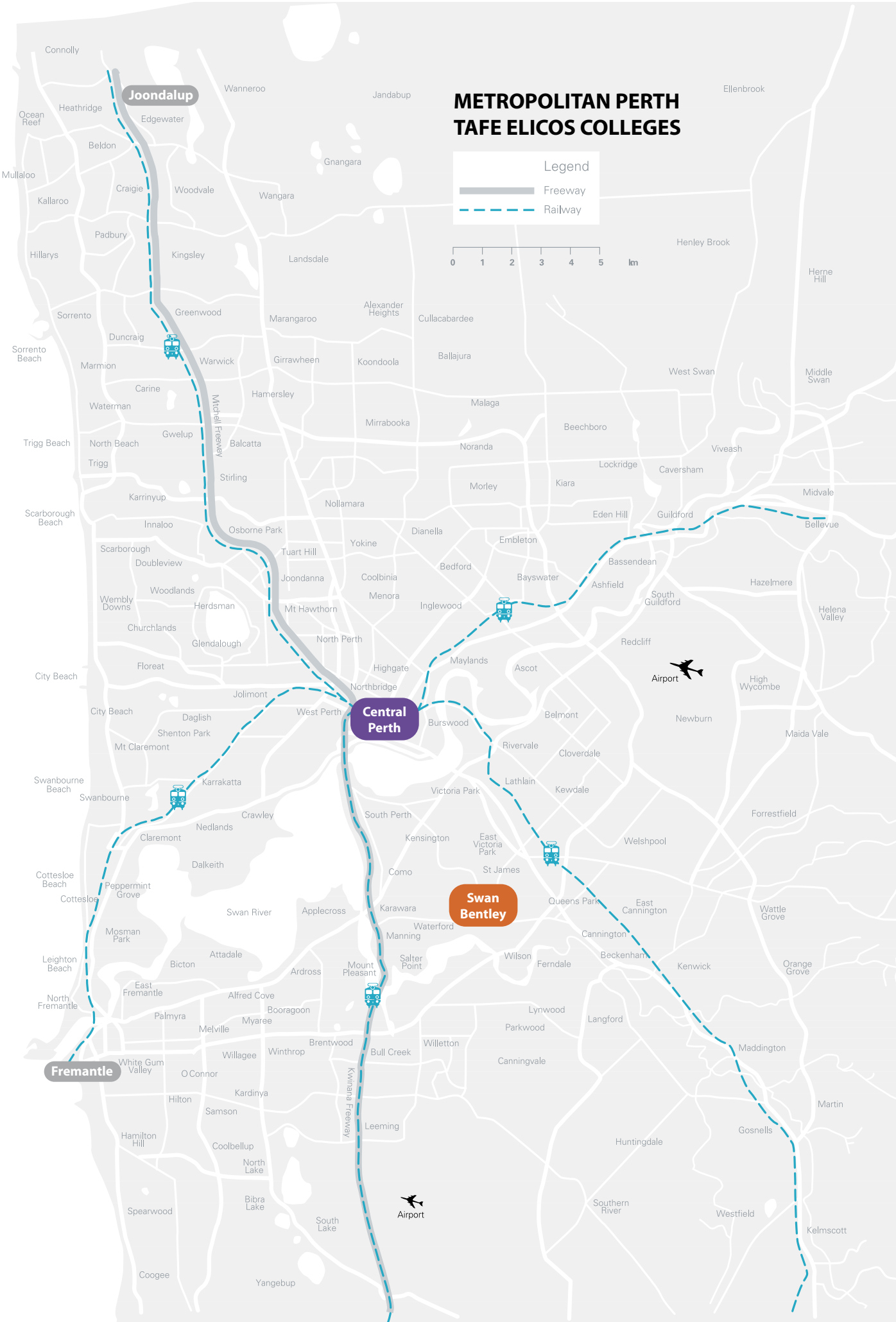

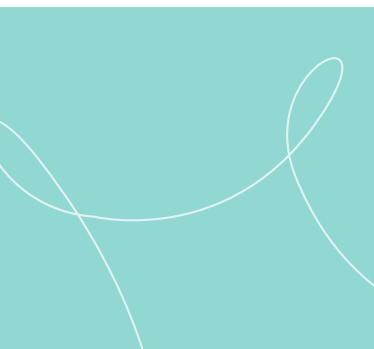
